Introduction

The current Multiannual Financial Framework ('MFF')— the EU's long-term budget — runs until the end of 2027. In 2025, the Commission will put forth comprehensive proposals for the next Multiannual Financial Framework and for the next generation of financing instruments. These funds will provide financial support to hundreds of thousands of beneficiaries such as international organisations, national and local authorities, Civil Society Organisations, businesses, farmers, students, scientists, within the EU, in partner countries and globally.

Following the political guidelines of President von der Leyen for the 2024-2029 European Commission, the Commission will work towards a simpler, more focused and responsive long-term budget that reflects the European strategic priorities with the ambition to be an "Investment Commission". Moreover, we will also need to revamp our external action financing, to make it more impactful and targeted for our partners and more aligned with our strategic interests.

The Commission's proposals will be designed to make it possible for the EU to deliver on the things that matter most, in areas where it can achieve more than Member States acting alone. This requires a careful assessment both of what has worked well in the past and what could be improved in the future. The next EU long-term budget will draw lessons from the current one – notably in terms of simplicity and flexibility, speed and strategic focus.

As an integral part of the process, the Commission is launching a series of public consultations to gather views from all interested parties on the future EU budget. This consultation covers EU external funding implemented in partner countries, sometime with Members States in a Team Europe approach. The decision to cluster issues serves to support the preparatory work and does not pre-empt the architecture of future programmes.

This questionnaire consists of three parts. Part 1 collects some information about you, while Part 2 contains questions related to the EU funds. Section 3 contains two closing questions.
